Supporting artists at art KARLSRUHE: the new "re:discover" format

Karlsruhe, 16.02.2024 - With funding from the Federal Government Commissioner for Culture and Media (BKM) and together with the Bundesverband Deutscher Galerien und Kunsthändler e.V. (BVDG), the upcoming art KARLSRUHE is placing a special emphasis on artists who, despite the high artistic quality of their work, have not (yet) received the attention they deserve.

The re:discover funding programme offers artistic positions that have remained under the radar for various reasons a broad space at an art fair for the first time. A total of 20 artists were selected by an expert jury from the applications submitted by art KARLSRUHE exhibitors for the first edition of the re:discover programme.

Among them is media art pioneer Dieter Jung, who was recently presented in a solo exhibition at the Centre for Art and Media (ZKM) in Karlsruhe (Galerie Kornfeld, Berlin). With his holograms, he broke down the boundaries of two-dimensionality back in the 1980s and enriched kinetic art with light and laser sculptures.

The artist Rune Miels (Galerie Judith Andreae, Bonn) represents a consistent position. She works with mathematical symbols and explores the abstract network of relationships created by their connections in her works. With her scientific way of working and the communication of knowledge, she is one of the "trailblazers" among artists.

The filmmaker Dore O. (Galerie Ricarda Fox, Mülheim), who died in 2022 at the age of 76 - she took part in documenta 5 and 6 - was described as one of the "most important pioneers of German experimental film". Her oeuvre consists of films, books, paintings and photographs. Her works give a great deal of space to experimentation; for example, she intervened in the chemical process of developing Polaroid photos.

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The painterly work of Dieter Schosser (Galerie Alfred Knecht, Karlsruhe) was characterised by formal rigour in the early years: "Circle, triangle and square are not much, and yet almost everything" - this is how the artist described the core of his work. It was only in his later work that he emancipated himself from such guidelines and developed a great deal of artistic freedom. Schosser now also uses plastic bags and discarded paper as a painting surface and paints with coffee or washing-up liquid. This results in very spontaneous, unconventional works.

The Berlin-based artist Frank Oehring (Malte Uekermann Kunsthandel, Berlin) is only well known to a few insiders in the art market. Over the past decades, the designer has realised countless works in public and semi-public spaces. In the early 1970s, for example, he created the iconic signage and information system as well as the central light sculpture in the ICC Berlin. For friends and clients, he was a bringer of light and a signifier of private interiors.

The re:discover funding programme also aims to contribute to the debate on artistic estates and the mechanisms of the art market. An integral part of the project is therefore a presentation of the Brauweiler Artists' Archive. Since its opening in 2010, the institution, which is located in a former abbey near Cologne, has been regarded as a model project for dealing with estates. Under the direction of the Stiftung Kunstfonds, selected artistic legacies are preserved, researched and exhibited here as cultural heritage.

The programme accompanying the "re:discover" format offers insights into the art market and sheds light on the various perspectives and mediation practices of its players. The ARTIMA art meeting will take place on 22 and 23 February at the fair and will be dedicated to the topic of "How art and the art market benefit from rediscoveries" with lectures and panel discussions.

With the re:discover promotional programme, art KARLSRUHE offers its visitors a unique discovery tour. All the artists presented have created a broad oeuvre and will be present at their galleries' stands with a wide variety of works and groups of works. Interested parties can familiarise themselves with the individual artistic positions on guided tours.



art KARLSRUHE with new impulses and formats

Karlsruhe, February 2024 - art KARLSRUHE - Klassische Moderne und Gegenwartskunst from 22 to 25 February 2024 is in the starting blocks and is coming up with a new concept and new formats. In one of the most beautiful exhibition centres in Europe, bright as daylight and pillar-free, art KARLSRUHE will provide an overview of 120 years of artistic creation. Classical Modernism and art after 1945 are at the centre of the fair. The presentations of contemporary art and current contemporary positions are in a stimulating exchange with these.

Preserving and developing

The dual leadership of project manager Olga Blaß and art KARLSRUHE advisory board chairman Kristian Jarmuschek agree on preserving the strengths of art KARLSRUHE and further developing its quality and structure on this basis. This also includes expanding successful and integral formats such as the sculpture squares and the sculpture garden to include sculpture spots in order to strengthen the qualities of this section. The Vollack Group, which already supports the Sculpture Garden, will extend its support to the Sculpture Spots.

New structure of the halls

The range of art on display will be maintained and at the same time the halls will be restructured to provide visitors with better orientation.

In future, 120 years of art history will begin at art KARLSRUHE in Hall 1 - entitled "Classical Modernism and Contemporary Art" - where the museum quality of the works shown by the exhibitors can be experienced in particular. Hall 2 - "Art after 1945 and Contemporary Art" - will showcase top-class post-war modernism in dialogue with contemporary art. Hall 3 - "Artication" -

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follows in the spatial arrangement of the halls, combining art and education. Here you will find the new "Paper Square" format for works with paper, this year's special exhibition by LBBW, the "Academy Square" for the curated positions of current graduates from Baden-Württemberg's art academies as well as a large number of cultural institutions such as the Centre for Art and Media (ZKM), art academies and art associations. The dm-arena, Hall 4 in the counting sequence, is entitled "Discover". It is dedicated to contemporary art.

Friends and newcomers

Further new formats were developed in dialogue with the galleries, such as "Newcomer", for which galleries founded in 2020 or later and with fewer than three participations in the fair could apply. Or the "Friends" format, where a gallery can be presented as a co-exhibitor at the stand of a befriended gallery.

re:discover - a look at unjustly forgotten artistic positions

In the new re:discover format, artists who have quite wrongly failed to attract the attention of the art market are once again made visible. This format aims to give more space to the contemporary and art-historical significance of unjustly forgotten artists. A total of 20 positions will be (re)discovered in the gallery booths in the re:discover format. The ARTIMA art meeting on 23 and 24 February is dedicated to rounding off topics such as "How to keep artistic heritage alive in a museum context" or "How to deal with estates: What happens after the death of artists to those works that are not purchased by museums or collections?"

Sculpture spots

Since the first edition, art KARLSRUHE has been characterised by its expansive sculpture spots. The special commitment to sculpture is also reflected in the fifth presentation of the Loth Sculpture Prize with partner L-Bank. Supported by the Vollack Group, numerous outdoor sculptures can be experienced in the sculpture garden (atrium). The sculpture spots, also supported by the Vollack



Group, will be a new addition, giving individual three-dimensional works even more space to be viewed in the visitor walkway and in the action hall.

Paper Square

The cornerstone of almost every collection is works on paper. The special presentation "Prints and Drawings", which has been organised for many years, has been further developed into Paper Square, where galleries can now present themselves in their own booths or hang prints in a special display format without personal attention from the gallery owner.

Academy Square

To support up-and-coming artists entering the art market, Academy Square is showing a curated presentation of 14 promising graduates from three art academies in Baden-Württemberg - the State Academy of Fine Arts Stuttgart, the State Academy of Fine Arts Karlsruhe and the Karlsruhe University of Arts and Design. Curated by Elke Buhr, editor-in-chief of MONOPOL magazine for art and life, and supported in partnership by LBBW, young talents are made visible and can be discovered by exhibitors and collectors.

"Nature - Beauty and Destruction" as the motto of the LBBW special exhibition

Karlsruhe, 25.01.2024 An impressive list of artists, a high-calibre line-up straight out of a picture book of contemporary art history: from Franz Ackermann and Anselm Kiefer to Diana Thater and Thomas Grünfeld to Olafur Eliasson and Andreas Gursky. What Landesbank Baden-Württemberg (LBBW) and its predecessor institutions have collected since 1970, totalling around 3,000 works, is truly impressive.

Sarah Haberkorn, Head of the LBBW Collection from January 2024, is curating a special exhibition entitled "Nature - Beauty and Destruction", which will present a changing field of tension between beauty and destruction with depictions of flora and fauna.

Sarah Haberkorn comments: "This raises critical questions about the relationship between man and nature: What place does nature have in culture? What is our relationship to nature? To what extent is nature repressed, adapted or manipulated? Where and how do destructive processes become visible?".

Haberkorn will cover a broad spectrum - from the Impressionist Max Slevogt, who painted the "Quarry near Albersweiler" in 1912, to the contemporary duo Julian Charrière and Julius von Bismarck, who recreated and blasted rock formations. Nature vandalism as a theme. According to Sarah Haberkorn, the work also deals with the question of "which landscapes are categorised as worthy of protection and what happens when they are destroyed".

The fact that the LBBW art collection was not only used decades ago to decorate the company's offices in a representative manner, but was also dedicated to promoting artists and the social issues of the time, is shown by the fact that the Landesbank has repeatedly acquired works over the past century that deal with issues such as identity, globalisation, digitalisation, the environment and sustainability.

art KARLSRUHE 2024:

This time the Hans Platschek Prize will be awarded to Paula Doepfner

Karlsruhe, 5 January 2024 - Marion Ackermann, General Director of the Dresden State Art Collections, attests to the "impressive topicality" of the text drawings by Paula Doepfner, born in 1980 and based in Berlin. The artist was a master student of Rebecca Horn at the Berlin University of the Arts and deals with crises and wars, including Auschwitz dramas. She is therefore regarded as an existentially orientated draughtswoman. She follows in the literary footsteps of writers such as Paul Celan and Robert Musil.

Marion Ackermann was invited by the award organiser - the Hans Platschek Foundation in Hamburg - to nominate a personality for the 2024 prize as a solo juror. The Hans Platschek Prize for Art and Writing has been awarded annually by the Platschek Foundation at art KARLSRUHE since 2008. Paula Doepfner's work, which often consists of spoken word and visual art, establishes a congenial relationship with Hans Platschek. The painter and writer, who last lived in Hamburg and died there in February 2000, was born in Berlin in 1923, like Paula Doepfner, had to emigrate from Nazi Germany with his family as a teenager and then studied at the art academy in Montevideo.

After returning from Uruguay in 1953, Hans Platschek quickly became a valued member of the informal circle. With his intellectual acumen, he opened up the artistic path to New Figuration as early as the end of the 1950s. A trailblazer and a double talent who sometimes hid his light under a bushel. "I am a painter and I write about art," Platschek liked to modestly introduce himself - even when he had long since been awarded Biennale and documenta honours.

Paula Doepfner is currently represented with an exhibition, "Darkness at the break of noon", at the Residenzschloss of the Dresden State Art Collections until 28 January 2024. During art KARLSRUHE 2024, she will engage in a dialogue with works by Hans Platschek in Hall 3 of the fair. The prizewinner, who frequently observes autopsies and makes sketches at the Charité hospital in Berlin, will impressively document for the general public that art is much more than just creating beautiful pictures. In the spirit of Hans Platschek.

The award ceremony will take place at the upcoming art KARLSRUHE on Thursday, 22 February 2024, 4 pm in the ARTIMA art Forum in Hall 2. The laudatory speech will be held by Dr Marion Ackermann, Director General of the Dresden State Art Collections. The artist Paula Doepfner will be present.

Impressive media art at art KARLSRUHE

UNESCO City of Media Arts showcases female perspectives in intergenerational dialogue with media art works

16.02.2024

Art, culture, media art and creativity will once again enter into a symbiotic partnership and merge into a cultural marketplace of artistic creation from February 22 to 25, 2024 at the center of this year's media art presentations at art KARLSRUHE.

This year, Karlsruhe's art and cultural institutions will once again present themselves collectively at art KARLSRUHE in their own area, the Forum Karlsruhe in hall 3. Media art is the centerpiece of the space on the central marketplace - as one of the pillars of Karlsruhe's identity. In addition to works from the archive of the ZKM | Center for Art and Media, the next generation of media artists from the Karlsruhe University of Arts and Design (HfG) will be presenting four of their own works and the scenographic design of the space. The two partner institutions, which played a key role in Karlsruhe's UNESCO title, are intensifying their cooperation following the change of management and are presenting a joint exhibition here for the first time outside of their own four walls:

The juxtaposition of world-famous female artists and HfG students will be realized under the title "Hybrid Echoes". The term "hybrid" refers to the fact that people shape their identity in many different ways. In their own way, they all contribute to understanding and shaping society by sharing their observations and experiences. The selection of works by students of the HfG was made first, which are juxtaposed with the selection of artworks from the ZKM. These works by a previous generation of artists from the ZKM archive show that they too have explored the question of their own identity in a media-saturated world. The aim is for visitors to find the "echoes", or similar patterns or familiar things, between the different female perspectives in the generational dialogue.

With equal prominence, a total of 7 works will be shown to the art-interested public in a scenography created especially for this occasion, which is inspired by a hybridization of the logos of the ZKM and the HfG. The following artists' works will be on display in the center of this scenographic design on the marketplace of the Forum Karlsruhe:

Dara Birnbaum: „MTV Art Break“ (ZKM), Luise Peschko: „Enna Wills Wissen“ (HfG), Miki Feller: „Prologue: At the Zoo“ und „Germania Girl“ (HfG), Nina Sobell: „Electro Encephalographic“, from the series „Infermental 4: Logique Emotionelle“ (ZKM), Pipilotti Rist: „(Entlastungen) Pipilottis Fehler [(Absolu - tions) Pipilotti's mistakes]“ (ZKM), Yuliana Mosheeva: „Antropea“ (HfG).

"The sense of life today and then, examined by the University of Arts and Design and the Centre for Art and Media, promises an intriguing exploration of society, but also of media art. What makes art different today than it was back then, how does society feel today, how did it feel back then? I am delighted that we are able to feature the two institutions at the center of the 'Forum Karlsruhe' this year, as they – and the ZKM in particular – were the key institutional players in winning the UNESCO title," says Dominika Szope, Head of the Department of Cultural Affairs of the City of Karlsruhe.

The UNESCO City of Media Arts will also be showing a media artwork by the Francis Karat collective at its booth, funded by the 2023 project funding program. Francis Karat designs creative interfaces between generative AI, film, photography and sound design with the aim of shaping a new artistic era that playfully and intuitively unfolds a popular postmodern media world between high culture and subculture. Their work "Grüße aus'm Schwarzwald" consists of postcards that are set in motion with image-to-video AI tools and are provided with additional sound design.

The art KARLSRUHE visitors are welcome to immerse themselves in the extensive media art presentation with the protagonists on site.

In 2019, Karlsruhe received the UNESCO designation 'Creative City of Media Arts' as the first and so far only city in Germany joining in the international UNESCO Creative Cities network. In Karlsruhe, against this backdrop, a network of more than 40 institutions from the fields of art, culture, science, creative industries, the digital scene, municipal enterprises and departments has committed itself to form a sustainable urban society with a special focus on creativity and culture.

The presentation of the UNESCO Creative City of Media Arts Karlsruhe and the exhibition of media artworks on the marketplace of the Forum Karlsruhe is being realized as a joint project with the support of the ZKM | Centre for Art and Media, the Karlsruhe University of Arts and Design, the Office of Cultural Affairs of the City of Karlsruhe, Karlsruhe Marketing und Event GmbH, the External Relations and Strategic Marketing Department of the City of Karlsruhe and Karlsruhe Messe- und Kongress GmbH.

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**Interview with project manager Olga Blaß and art KARLSRUHE advisory board
chairman Kristian Jarmuschek**

Ms. Blaß, Mr. Jarmuschek, you are the new dual leadership of art KARLSRUHE. How do you want to develop the event further?

Kristian Jarmuschek: It is very important to us to build on the basic ideas of fair founder Ewald Karl Schrade and develop them further. We are therefore interested in an evolution, not a revolution. In this context, the sculpture spaces are central, as is the connection between classical modernism and contemporary art, as well as post-war modernism and contemporary art.

Olga Blaß: One of our big wishes is also to significantly expand our catchment area and make art KARLSRUHE known beyond the southwest of Germany. And, of course, our vision is to continuously adapt the fair to the times - without losing sight of our roots.

At first glance, the new hall structure is striking. What are the thoughts behind this change?

KJ: Until now, the institutions of the city and state of Baden-Württemberg as well as the areas of printmaking, photography and multiples have been represented in Hall 1. Ewald Karl Schrade had the vision of creating an exhibition that would also be accessible to the general public of art lovers and that would also be within their financial means. His aim was to provide an entry point, particularly through photography, multiples and other editioned works. As there are no longer any galleries that exclusively show photography or prints, we have set ourselves the task of reinterpreting the question of entry. With this in mind, we are creating Paper Square in Hall 3, an area for all works on paper where galleries can rent additional space. The same hall is also home to the institutions, the special show and the Academy Square for graduates from art colleges in the region, a curated exhibition whose applicants are specially selected by a jury.

Apart from Academy Square, are there any other special offers for young artists?

Young talent does indeed play a central role at this year's art KARLSRUHE, also with regard to the galleries. We enable young galleries that have been on the market for less than three years to participate in the fair as newcomers with a certain amount of basic support. They can apply for this program and participate with 25 square meters of stand space at a reduced price. In this way, we give them the chance to test themselves at an internationally networked trade fair. Our aim is, of course, for this to develop into regular participation.

Last year 207 participants exhibited at art KARLSRUHE, this year there are 177. Why have you reduced the number of galleries?

OB: The reduction in the number of participants was a very conscious decision. The number of applicants was as good as ever. In this respect, we had a good reflection that the programs and our ideas were attracting a great deal of interest.

CJ: As part of our reorientation, we want to attract galleries that support the impulse to transform art Karlsruhe. Therefore, our idea was to be stricter in the selection process, especially for galleries that previously felt at home in Hall 1 and did not submit a new proposal for one of the other hall areas. The Advisory Board, to whom we presented our ideas, voted in favor of this approach. That's why there are fewer and different galleries. Many of them are very closely associated with the fair and are seriously concerned about its well-being and positive development. Some of them have actively supported us in the acquisition process and have approached friendly galleries. With art KARLSRUHE 2024, we want to show galleries that are interested but have not yet applied what kind of field of participants we would like to see for the future of Art Karlsruhe.


